Tearing Up: Another Look at Tares Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

What are some characteristics for your ideal world?

- I. What are the wheat seeds?
 - A. They are known by the angels
 - a) There isn't confusion as to who is a wheat and who is a tare
 - b) There is intention to keep the two growing together
 - B. They are what is wanted and intended
 - a) The crop was planned for (Eph 1:3-6)
 - b) The crop has a purpose
 - C. Sons of the kingdom
 - a) They do what the King commands (Matt 22:37-40)
 - b) But the kingdom is not of this world (John 18:36-38)
- We fight for truth, not land or control.
- II. What are these tares?
 - A. They are sons of the wicked one
 - a) The diabolos false accuser, slanderer, against truth
 - b) Deceived by the adversary (John 8:42-47)
 - B. They are not wanted or intended
 - a) They do things to service themselves
 - b) They take what is intended for the wheat
 - c) They are past feeling/caring (Eph 4:147-24)
- We must decide our influence.

III. What are you?

- *A. In the world (Rom 12:1-2)*
 - a) Both seeds are agents of influence in the world
 - b) Resisting the tares strengthens you (James 1:2-3)
 - c) We are supposed to be in this world (John 17:9-19)
 - *i.* Jesus' prayer is for our strength, not for an earthly kingdom
 - *ii.* He's not praying for the world to be better (Mark 13:5-13)

- B. Are you tearing or tearing?
 - a) We tear everything down just to rebuild it in our image (Matt 23:15)
 - *i.* The pharisees wanted an earthly kingdom
 - *ii.* They should consider weightier matters (Matt 23:23)
 - b) Jesus is the consolation of His people (Matt 23:37-39, Luke 2:25-35)
 - *i.* He understands the state we are in and weeps (John 11:32-38)
 - *ii.* Death and loss wasn't part of the plan for us
 - *iii.* We did this to ourselves (Is 53:1-6)
- C. Embrace your true liberty (Gal 5:13-15)
 - a) Because we have a choice we need to be intentional
 - b) We can chose to serve in love or to bite and devour
- D. We don't need to know who's a tare and who's a wheat (Rom 10:13-17)
 - a) Our calling is to show people Who Jesus is
 - b) We aren't to separate from others
